



Fredericktown Stadium Safety & Rehabilitation Project



Project Description:

The Fredericktown Stadium Safety and Rehabilitation Project is being undertaken during 2010 to address major safety and compliance concerns with our football stadium. The current stadium bleachers and press boxes are over 40 years old and pose a great deal of risk and liability to the community and the school system. There are a number of items to be addressed with this project, including...

- *Replacement of substructure and seating surfaces with maintenance free aluminum*
- *Bring bleachers into compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)*
- *Bring bleachers into compliance with spacing of flooring to seating surface*
- *Bring Railings into compliance with current safety codes*
- *Eliminate the potential of total bleacher system collapse*
- *Eliminate the potential of children falling through the railings or between seats*

We are presently attempting to raise money for the project through grants, fund raisers, and other means including the sale of Reserved Seating. The money raised will be used to purchase the new bleachers as soon as the financial goal is met. The form below may be used to secure your Reserved Seats for all athletic events held at the stadium.
